## Arkansas Soybean Association Announces Additional 100 Bushel/Acre Producers

Little Rock, AR (November 16, 2017) – The Grow for the Green Soybean Yield Challenge is pleased to announce that Perry Galloway from Gregory, Arkansas and his wife Mary Galloway have each achieved the 100 Bushel/Acre soybean yield. Perry produced 108.904 bu/ac with Hefty Seed Variety 48X7 a RR2X variety. Perry planted on April 12 and harvested on October 12. Mary produced 107.564 b/ac by planting Hefty 49X7S on April 10. The RR2X variety was harvested on September 28.
